A Message to our Partners and Friends

The Community Foundation for Ireland (CFI) makes a difference by making giving effective and investing in people and solutions to benefit communities throughout Ireland. Within CFI, we believe in the power of philanthropy to deliver just and progressive social change. We empower people and organisations who want to make a difference through a model of philanthropy which is based on trust, effectiveness and impact. This model has proven its effectiveness for over one hundred years since the first community foundation was established in 1914; there are now over 1800 globally.

Notwithstanding an unsettled year internationally on the economic and political fronts, CFI continued to see strong growth. CFI's cumulative grant making exceeded €30 million since it was set up in 2000. In 2016 alone, over €5.7 million in grants was distributed, the highest amount we have ever given out in a single year. CFI's endowed fund exceeded €40 million at the year end.

We thank everyone who supported The Community Foundation for Ireland in 2016 by believing and investing in our work. As with most aspects of life in a fast moving society, the nature and structure of philanthropy is constantly changing and evolving. With the closing of The Atlantic Philanthropies and the cessation of funding on the part of the Joseph Rowntree Charitable Trust, we believe there is an urgency to encourage more structured and strategic philanthropic giving in Ireland and on a larger scale. CFI is committed to playing its part by supporting donors on their philanthropic journey and working with Government and other stakeholders to ensure a more encouraging environment for philanthropy. We believe that our experience over the past sixteen years provides us with a solid platform to play such a leadership role.

I would like to thank the CFI board and particularly Louis FitzGerald, our outgoing Chairperson, for his unstinting support of The Community Foundation for Ireland for many years and for his visionary and dedicated leadership in his term as Chair.

A few words ... Tina Roche

In a year when Ireland reflected back on its development as a nation over the last 100 years, The Community Foundation for Ireland took the opportunity to look at what it means to belong in Ireland today.

Our work was informed by a special VitalSigns Report into Belonging, inspired by the Community Foundations of Canada who have been leaders in signalling the importance of belonging in our communities and in mobilising the power of community knowledge for greater impact.

In 2016, CFI awarded over €600,000 to community and voluntary groups across Ireland to increase the sense of belonging in Ireland. In parallel with the Belonging 16 initiative, CFI continued to support the community and voluntary sector through its ongoing programme of grants and through the generosity of its donors.

Within CFI, we learnt a lot through our Belonging initiative. The Community Gathering Grants offered a great opportunity to go back to our roots and reminded us of the power of small grassroots grants. Equally, it once again brought home the fact that one of Ireland's greatest strengths is the rich tapestry of local and community groups. These span so many spheres of life and are powered by the dedicated commitment of volunteers across every parish and community in Ireland who welcomed the opportunity to celebrate what it means to belong. As part of our commitment to investing in strong and resilient communities, The Community Foundation for Ireland (CFI) will continue to make belonging and inclusion a major focus of our work in the coming years.

Social change is rarely achieved overnight. While some societal issues can be solved quickly and with a once off injection of funds, most need persistent attention and sustained support over a period of years. The Community Foundation for Ireland is here for the long term. CFI makes a lasting impact by acting as a catalyst to address tough societal problems and to build stronger communities - today and in the decades to come. Governance and compliance

The Community Foundation for Ireland is a company limited by guarantee. The Memorandum and Articles of Association signed on 6 February, 2001 is the founding governance document of CFI and provides that the business and affairs of the Company shall be managed by the Board of Directors. The Board of The Community Foundation are committed to attaining the highest standards of corporate governance. Accordingly, within CFI, transparency and accountability are constant priorities of the Board, its dedicated Finance, Audit, Investment and Governance Sub Committee and the staff of CFI. Detailed information on the Directors' Code of Conduct and Directors' Duties, as well as a number of policies and procedures (such as in relation to conflicts of interest and whistle blowers) are included in the governance section of our website. This section of the website also includes detailed information in relation to other areas including CFI's articles of association, salary information and its sustainability policy. The Community Foundation for Ireland was one of the first charities to comply with the Governance Code for community, voluntary and charitable organisations in Ireland which promotes high standards of governance and transparency in the charity sector. The Code provides clear guidelines on the roles, duties and responsibilities of those who run community, voluntary and charitable organisations.

CFI adheres to the Statement of Guiding Principles for Fundraising and its accounts are presented according to SORP (the Statement of Recommended Practice) for Accounting and Reporting by Charities. Equally, all grant making is undertaken within a rigorous process which is overseen by the Board and its Grants Assessment Panel.

As part of the risk management process, an annual risk review is undertaken by senior managers and the report is considered by the Finance Audit, Investment and Governance Committee for any mitigating actions that need to be undertaken. The external auditors review and assess the internal controls as part of the annual audit. Overall, the Board is satisfied that systems are in place to monitor, manage and mitigate The Community Foundation for Ireland's risk exposure.

Leadership

The Board of Directors comprises volunteers representing the diversity and broad interests of our community who provide the leadership to conduct the affairs of CFI.

2016 Highlights and Learnings

Highlights

Philanthropist of the Year Awards

The winners of the ninth annual Philanthropist of the Year awards were announced in February 2017. The 2016 winners were:

- **Maurice Healy** as National Philanthropist of the Year for his significant support for a number of charities including Social Entrepreneurs Ireland (SEI), An Cosán and Anam Cara;
- **Applegreen** as Corporate Philanthropist of the Year in generating over €1 million in support for a number of children's charities including Barnardos, ISPC and Debra;
- **SAP** as International Philanthropist of the Year for their Africa CodeWeek initiative which to date has supported over 400,000 young people in Africa.

€30 million in grants made since 2000

By the end of 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland's cumulative grant-making exceeded €30 million in grants since it was set up in 2000. In 2016, there were over 70 donor advised funds at CFI and we worked with over 4,000 community and voluntary organisations to support social change in Ireland

The Year of Belonging

In February 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland officially launched the year of Belonging by hosting a community gathering on O'Connell Street. Throughout 2016 we had a set of dedicated grant rounds aimed at increasing the sense of belonging in Ireland and also produced a special edition VitalSigns Belonging report.

The report surveyed almost 1,000 people in Ireland to find out what it means to belong and highlights how some of the most marginalised groups in our society feel about their sense of place, including lone parents, travellers, LGBT+ and those with a disability. Working with the third sector

In January 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland, The Wheel and Clann Credo published "Lets Commission for Communities - valuing the community and voluntary approach to human, social and community services". This report highlights the contribution of the community and voluntary sector to society and encourages the government to value the role community and voluntary organisations play in delivering public services. Family Philanthropy initiatives

In June 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland hosted its second family philanthropy seminar which was addressed by a number of CFI donors, as well as Professor Cathy Pharoah, a leading researcher in philanthropy in the UK. Much of the discussion focussed on engaging the next generation in philanthropy which was also a topic for one of the quarterly meeting of CFI's Advisory Group of Professional Advisers in September. Individuals and families are increasingly thinking about how they might engage other family members in their giving and CFI has a number of family funds which are involving the next generation in their philanthropy.

Collaborative Giving

During 2016, CFI continued to see encouraging signs of the potential for collaborative giving on the part of donors - both within The Community Foundation for Ireland and with other trusts and foundations. A number of donors added their support to CFI grants, leveraging greater support for important causes and initiatives. For example, CFI and a number of its donors are supporting SAFE Ireland and its ambitious programme of work to change culture and practice in respect of domestic violence in Ireland. CFI has a number of collaborative strategic funding initiatives with other trusts including the Former Offenders Fund with The St Stephen's Green Trust, as well as the Parenting Support Initiative in association with The Katharine Howard Foundation.

Belonging Grantee, The Ark

“The Ark was delighted to receive funding from The Community Foundation for Ireland as part of the Belonging grant round. Funding enables us to travel to Direct Provision centres to deliver drama workshops to children. The workshops allow children to express themselves creatively through fun and interactive drama workshops. After the children experience workshops at their centre they are facilitated in attending cultural events at The Ark. Being able to visit The Ark has had a huge impact on these children and their families. For most children, the visit to A Christmas Carol during Christmas 2016 was their very first time at a theatre show. One father commented ‘money cannot buy you this, this is special!’”





Learnings

Continuous improvement is a hallmark of how The Community Foundation for Ireland works and also in ensuring that we evaluate the effectiveness of how we allocate resources, including through our grant making. The following are some insights gained from working with our donors and grantees in 2016:

Donors:

The ongoing need for impeccable standards of governance has been a consistent and central priority of CFI since its establishment in 2000. A high profile controversy in 2016 highlighted the ongoing need to pay constant attention to accountability and transparency and to communicate our governance arrangements to all our stakeholders on a regular basis, as well as being clear about external factors which are outside CFI's control.

A survey of donors undertaken late in 2016 indicates that 97.3% of our donors see CFI's integrity and trustworthiness as being a most important factor for them in choosing to entrust their giving to CFI. The Survey also identifies some areas where donors would be interested in additional support; both in terms of identifying grant opportunities and receiving more information - for example, in relation to CFI's investment strategy and performance.

Grantees

Feedback from our grantees on the popularity and usefulness of small grants resulted in the community gathering grants as part of the Year of Belonging. As part of a commitment to continuously improving its grant making processes, CFI undertakes an annual Grants Survey. The 2016 survey was circulated widely to our grants community and 251 responses were received. Feedback from our grants community provided valuable insights and prompts as to how we can further improve. Arising from this feedback, key commitments in 2017 include:

- **Communications:** With such a wide-ranging grants community, CFI's website is central to its communication strategy. In 2017, we will review and upgrade our website. While the survey indicated that the majority (86%) of respondents provided a positive assessment of the current website, the survey is timely as it has provided comments that can inform the redevelopment of the website.
- **Feedback:** As in previous surveys, the issue of receiving feedback on grant applications was raised. While it will not be possible for The Community Foundation for Ireland to provide individual feedback in all instances, we are committed to examining our application process in 2017 with a view to incorporating an element of feedback, possibly on a grant round basis.
- **Outcome reporting:** In 2017, CFI will introduce online outcome reports for use in all future grants where reporting is required. This will also include an automated system of reminders to grantees in advance of reporting due dates. The online reporting will streamline the process of reminding grantees of due dates. This will aid grantees in managing the requirement to report.

What We Do

The Community Foundation for Ireland focuses its work around four core areas:

- Raising the level and effectiveness of philanthropy in Ireland;
- Making giving effective and transforming generosity into lasting change;
- Investing in people and solutions to build stronger communities;
- Achieving operational excellence.

Raising the level and effectiveness of philanthropy in Ireland

During 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland played its part in promoting greater philanthropy in Ireland through a number of initiatives and events which included:

- The 2016 Philanthropist of the Year Awards which were held in February 2017 at which Maurice Healy, AppleGreen and SAP were Award recipients;
- The launch of the VitalSigns Belonging report as a resource for donors. First published in Canada almost a decade ago, the VitalSigns report is a scorecard on how a country is faring across key social areas;
- Working closely with professional advisers including solicitors, tax advisers, accountants and wealth managers, greatly assisted by the CFI Professional Advisers Advisory Group;
- Fostering strategic partnerships with a number of other organisations, including Business in the Community Ireland, UKCF (the network of Community Foundations in the UK), The Community Foundation for Northern Ireland and Trans Giving Europe.

Family Fund at The Community Foundation for Ireland

“ So how did we guide our children into philanthropy? Actually it is very easy because young people are naturally inclined to be kind, non-judgmental and generous. When they become adults, to keep the momentum going, we decided that we would like them to manage their own giving fund. Here was their chance to have an impact on the issues that were pulling at their heartstrings.

Practically though, it was not as easy as we thought it would be. We wanted them to manage their fund yet we felt that they needed support and we did not want to influence them nor did we feel that we had the expertise to guide them properly. This is the reason why we asked The Community Foundation for Ireland to step in.

From regular reminders to lists of relevant causes to choose from, to organising meetings down to practically holding their hands throughout the whole process, CFI has been so supportive. As an added bonus the fund has given my children a focus outside their busy working lives and an opportunity to bounce ideas off each other, thereby strengthening their closeness as siblings.”



Making giving easy and transforming generosity into lasting change

The Community Foundation for Ireland helps people and organisations make a difference by making giving easy and by investing in people and solutions to benefit communities throughout Ireland. In 2016 we offered such support in a number of ways including:

- Working with donors to optimise their philanthropic giving. The Community Foundation for Ireland has more than 70 Donor Advised Funds and collaborative partnerships. Eight new Donor Advised Funds were established in 2016;
- Providing a bespoke service to donors to support their giving; CFI staff work closely with donors in administering their charitable donations as well as providing advice and support in relation to their grant making;
- Offering a suite of giving options ranging from once off donations and short term flow-through funds, through to longer term endowed funds and legacy gifts. During 2016, CFI developed a term fund offering which is suited to larger donations where the donor intends to spend their donation over a fixed term period e.g. 7-10 years;
- Facilitating partnerships between donors and relevant organisations in the non-profit sector, as well as partnering with other trusts and foundations. These included the Katharine Howard Foundation, the Atlantic Philanthropies, the St Stephen's Green Trust and an anonymous trust in relation to our youth work stream.

SAP Fund at The Community Foundation for Ireland

"In 2015 we launched an initiative called Africa Code week, which is currently in its second year. 2016 was fantastic for the programme, we had 30 countries, 30 governments, NGO's and over 100 volunteers all working together to make it happen, reaching out to over 426,000 children. We are delighted to have received the Philanthropist of the Year Award from The Community Foundation for Ireland; it's like the icing on the cake. It's the recognition that we haven't just been following our own dream but something bigger in the world."

Investing in people and solutions to build stronger communities

Grant making is at the heart of The Community Foundation for Ireland's activities and is inextricably linked to the sterling work of local community groups and charities throughout Ireland, many of whom continue to struggle to raise much-needed resources. In 2016, grants exceeding €5.7 million were made in support of community groups and charitable organisations, including:

- In 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland awarded over €600,000 to community and voluntary groups across Ireland to increase the sense of belonging in Ireland. 400 grants of €250 were provided to communities across Ireland to host Community gatherings, encouraging locals to get to know their neighbours. The remaining €500,000 was provided in grants to groups who work with families at risk of homelessness, refugees and transgender identities and experiences. Each grant scheme was aimed at promoting and increasing the sense of belonging for these groups and their communities;
- Grants to support advocacy and civic engagement on the part of older people were supported through the Older Persons' Fund (supported by The Atlantic Philanthropies);
- CFI's Impact Grants through which CFI addresses recurring issues or themes which may benefit from more strategic or longer term funding. In 2016, CFI committed Impact Grants exceeding €325,000 to a wide spectrum of organisations including Safe Ireland, SpunOut and Irish Penal Reform Trust. CFI provides long-term strategic support in order to tackle pressing social issues in Irish society, some of which include domestic violence, youth unemployment, Traveller inequality and mental health;
- The Community Foundation for Ireland managed and administered grant schemes on behalf of a number of trusts and foundations including The Tony Ryan Fund for Tipperary, Dúnlaoi Teoranta, the Tomar Trust and a number of corporates in relation to community benefit schemes. The County Monaghan Fund continued its grant making in 2016 in support of a number of projects in the county;
- Through the generosity of its donors, a wide range of individual grants were also made to non-profit organisations and projects throughout Ireland, as well as to overseas charities. Particular priorities for donors in 2016 included homelessness, education and health.

Achieving operational excellence

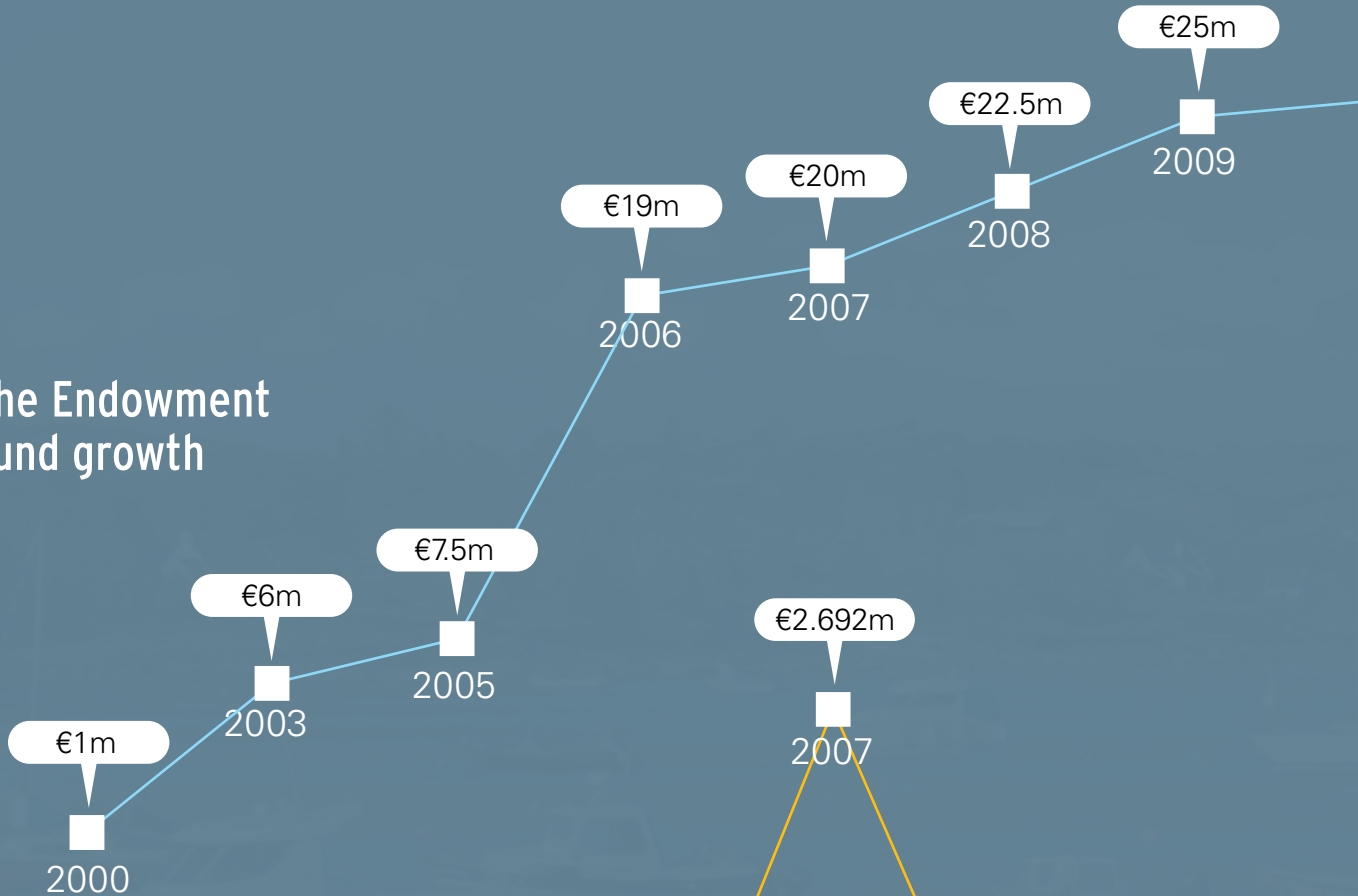
During 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland continued to strive to demonstrate value for money and best practice in all our areas of activity. As part of an international network of over 1,800 community foundations, CFI draws on a great diversity of experience in areas such as grant making, marketing and donor care. In 2016, this included learning from the Canadian Community Foundations in relation to the Belonging initiative, as well as attendance at a number of United Kingdom Community Foundation Network (UKCF) events. In line with an ongoing commitment to draw on best practice in philanthropy, 2016's work programme also included visits to the King Baudouin Foundation in Brussels and The Carnegie Trust in Scotland.

Integrity is a core value of The Community Foundation for Ireland in terms of accountability, transparency and strong governance for those who entrust their funds to our stewardship. CFI takes its stewardship role of donors and their funds very seriously and since its inception in 2000, has adopted prudent investing and spending policies and also has a donor charter. During 2016, CFI's Board and staff worked hard to ensure high satisfaction levels on the part of fund holders and donors. A survey of donors conducted late in 2016 confirmed high levels of satisfaction with CFI services as well as some areas for improvement. These included the opportunity to provide some donors with more advice in relation to their grant making, as well as more information in relation to the Foundation's investment of funds.

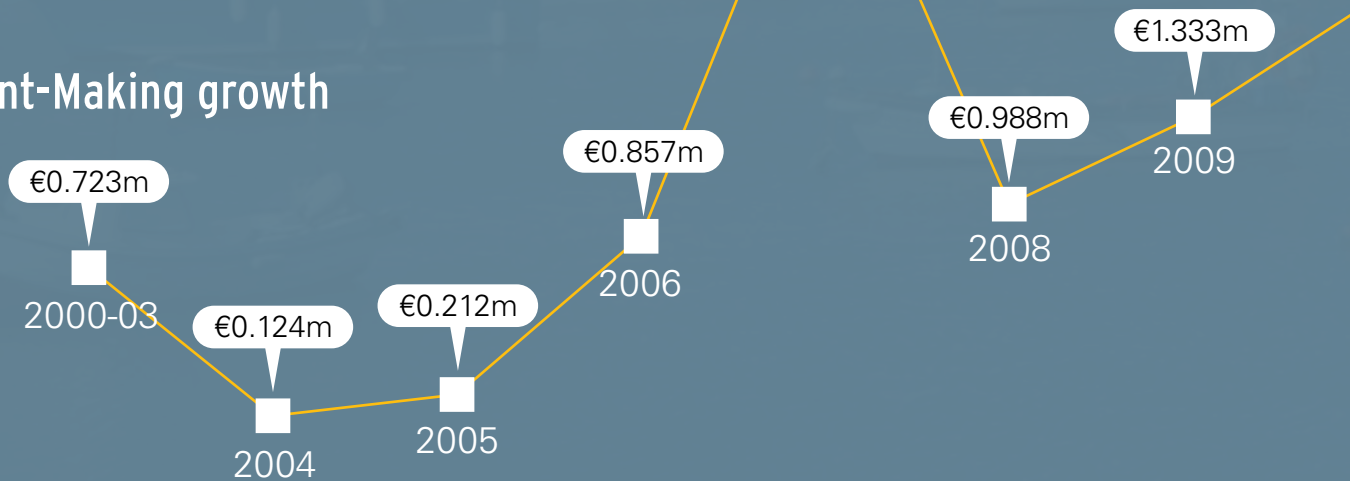
During 2015 and 2016, a new CRM system 'D2' was successfully introduced which is a bespoke version of the Digits system developed by UKCF and an upgrade of an earlier version of the system. A significant programme of investment underpinned the implementation of the system which is critical for maximising operational excellence, delivering efficient grant making and ensuring donor care.

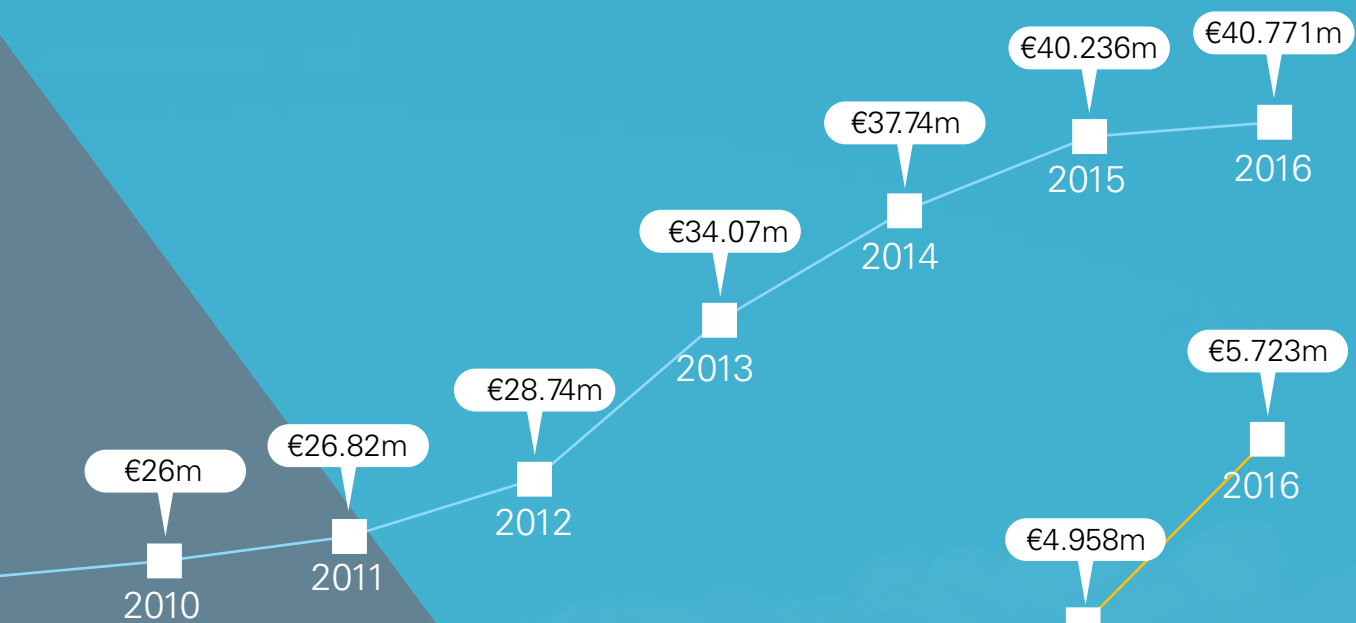

Fund Management 2016

The Endowment Fund (the Fund) is a tax-exempt fund and is held in trust by the Board of Directors of CFI. The operation of the Fund is governed by CFI's Memo and Articles of Association which also sets down the powers and responsibilities of the Directors in relation to the Fund. In 2016, CFI established a second fund, a Term Fund which is also a tax-exempt fund which is held in trust and invested by the Board of Directors of CFI.

a. Endowed Fund

The main purpose and priority of the Endowed Fund is the delivery of a consistent and sustainable amount each year from the Fund's income and/or capital for grant making. The level of drawdown for grant making is set with the objective of protecting indefinitely the nominal value of the Fund's capital and providing a buffer against future inflation. Specifically, other than in exceptional circumstances, an amount of 4% of the average end of years values for each of the previous five years is made available each year for grant making, regardless of the income or capital returns generated by the Fund in that year. The Fund's current Investment Manager is Sarasin & Partners who were appointed to manage the Fund for a three year term from 1 January 2015 (the transfer of the Fund's assets took place on the 23rd April 2015).

The total value of the assets held by the Manager on behalf of the Endowed Fund at 31st December 2016 was €40,771,436*. At 1st January 2016, the total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Fund was €40,392,447. During the year, the Investment Manager received €63,839, representing donations received from donors for investment in the Fund. The Fund also received investment income during the year (including tax reclaimed) of €1,075,952. A total amount of €1,220,465 was made available to CFI to meet its grant making requirements and to cover its administrative costs. A further €178,438 was deducted to meet the Investment Manager's fees and other investment expenses. During the year, the fund achieved a total capital appreciation of €638,095.

b. Term Fund

The Term Fund differs from the Endowment Fund in that the amount originally donated by each donor, and the investment return earned, will be fully spent down over an agreed period of years by making amounts which have been pre agreed with the donor available for grant making on a regular basis. The donation to the Term Fund in April 2016 was in the form of equity shares in a quoted company. The Fund's initial Investment Manager is Investec. The amount received by the manager for investment, following the sale of the shares and a transfer out of €550,000 for the initial year's grant making was €2,829,190. The total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Term Fund at 31 December 2016 was €2,959,121. This includes investment income earned and capital appreciation during the period and also takes account of amounts paid out for grant making and fees.

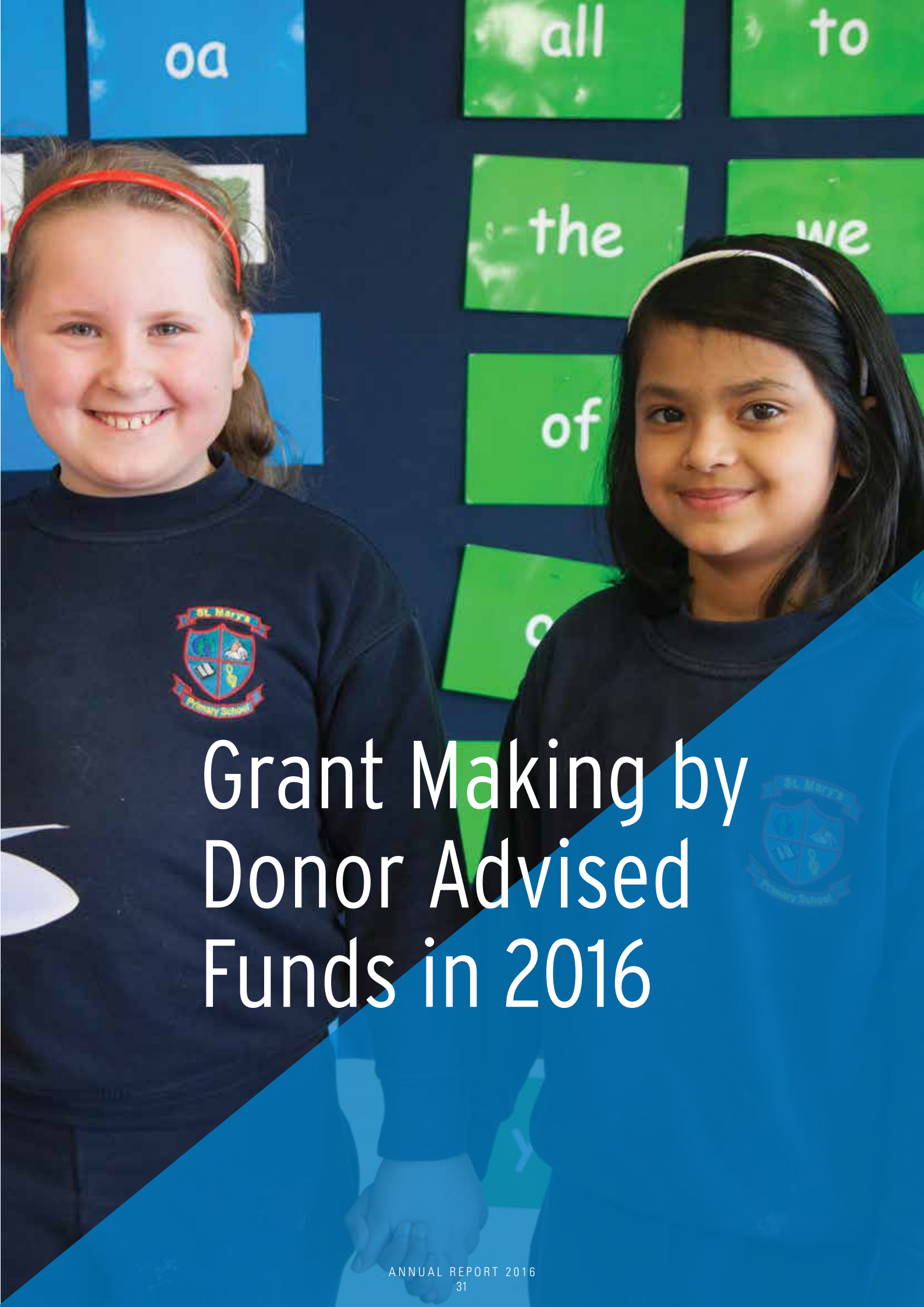
