A message to our partners and friends



We are delighted to present our Annual Report for 2018 and to let you know how our Irish and international donors are making an impact on social issues, and supporting the community and voluntary sector.

Within The Community Foundation for Ireland, it is our privilege to work with donors of major and minor means in supporting their philanthropy. People have many reasons for giving through The Community Foundation for Ireland; in our experience the overriding motivation for those who have done well is that they want to give back. They want to thank a community or organisation that helped them succeed and ensure that causes they care for are looked after. They want to create a legacy that supports the places they come from and causes they believe in. They may wish to engage other family members in their giving and, at times, to create an impact that lasts beyond their own lifetime. Without their support we would not have been able to support over 600 organisations in 2018 to carry on their significant work.

Community Foundations provide an ideal route to structured, strategic and long-term giving. Community foundations are a proven, effective


and enduring model of philanthropy and have been around for over 100 years. There are now over 1,800 community foundations worldwide, across 74 countries, including 669 community foundations in Europe.

The Community Foundation for Ireland was established in the year 2000, bringing the community foundation model to Ireland. From the outset, we have had a long-term perspective in line with our commitment to help grow a philanthropic ethos within Ireland and to build a long-term perpetual fund to support charitable causes and communities.

The Community Foundation for Ireland is committed to the Charities Governance Code and to being transparent and accountable. 2018 was a good year for The Community Foundation for Ireland, with donations and income from investments exceeding €8 million. Highlights of the year included the 11th Philanthropist of the Year Awards and the publication of a number of policy reports including Legacies for Good, Wealth Transfers and the Potential for Philanthropy and the Future of Social Housing report. We were also pleased to launch two new funds within The Community Foundation for Ireland - the LGBT+ Fund to coincide with the 30th anniversary of GCN in June 2018, and the Environment and Nature Fund. By the end of 2018, our cumulative grant making exceeded €44 million. Collectively,

The Community Foundation for Ireland and our donors made grants in excess of €7.5m in 2018, the highest level of grant making to date.

We thank everyone who supported The Community Foundation for Ireland in 2018 by believing and investing in our work. The key focus of the three-year strategy (2018-20) is on Giving, Grant making and Growing for Social Change. The work programme and resources of The Community Foundation for Ireland will be focused on meeting these objectives between now and the end of 2020, in support of social change and strong communities in Ireland. We would like to thank the Board of The Community Foundation for Ireland, our committed volunteers, our strategic partners, our generous donors and the staff at The Community Foundation for Ireland.

Growing strategic giving in Ireland



Ireland has a wonderful community and voluntary sector which spans the length and breadth of the country, and touches every parish

and hinterland across Ireland. These charitable organisations provide crucial services to vulnerable people and support many important causes and projects.


Notwithstanding the strong economic recovery of recent years, resources remain scarce in the not-for-profit sector, with many worthwhile organisations and projects struggling to find the requisite resources. There can be no doubt that when it comes to the provision of social services, Government bears the main responsibility. However, no government can meet every social need or has the flexibility to adapt to every issue. There is more to be done and philanthropy has a crucial role to play.

2018 was the first year of a three year strategy running from 2018 through to the end of 2020. A key focus of the strategy is to encourage more strategic giving and to ensure that The Community Foundation for Ireland optimises its contribution to growing philanthropy in Ireland.

We do this in a variety of ways such as meeting donors who want to 'give back' and helping them map out their potential charitable impact. We also host the annual Philanthropist of the Year Awards which celebrate the contribution made

by philanthropists. Importantly, the Awards bring forward role models for philanthropy, an area which is underdeveloped in Ireland. The Community Foundation for Ireland believes that we need a more encouraging environment for philanthropy. During 2018, working closely with Philanthropy Ireland, we advocated for Government action to promote and encourage more philanthropy in Ireland. We also commissioned research which highlighted the significant potential to grow charitable legacies arising from inter-generational transfers of wealth.

The Community Foundation for Ireland stands for a fair, caring and vibrant Ireland for now and in the future. The Community Foundation for Ireland is here for the long-term. It makes a lasting impact by acting as a catalyst to address tough societal problems and to build stronger communities - today and in the decades to come. We work with donors of major and minor means. In 2018 we made 647 grants with the vast majority dedicated to tackling strategic social issues. 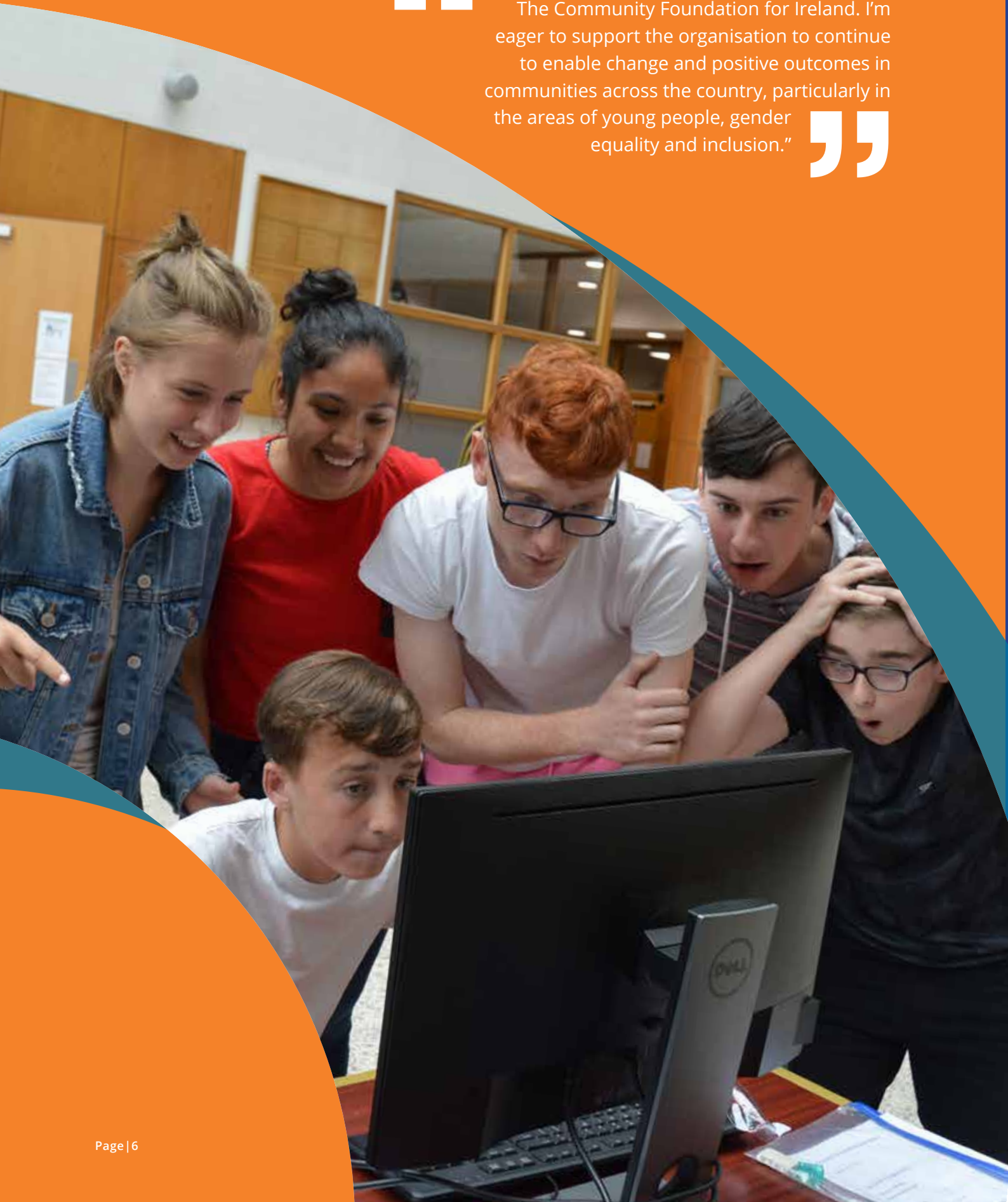

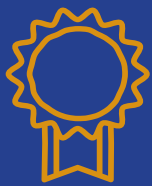


Who we are

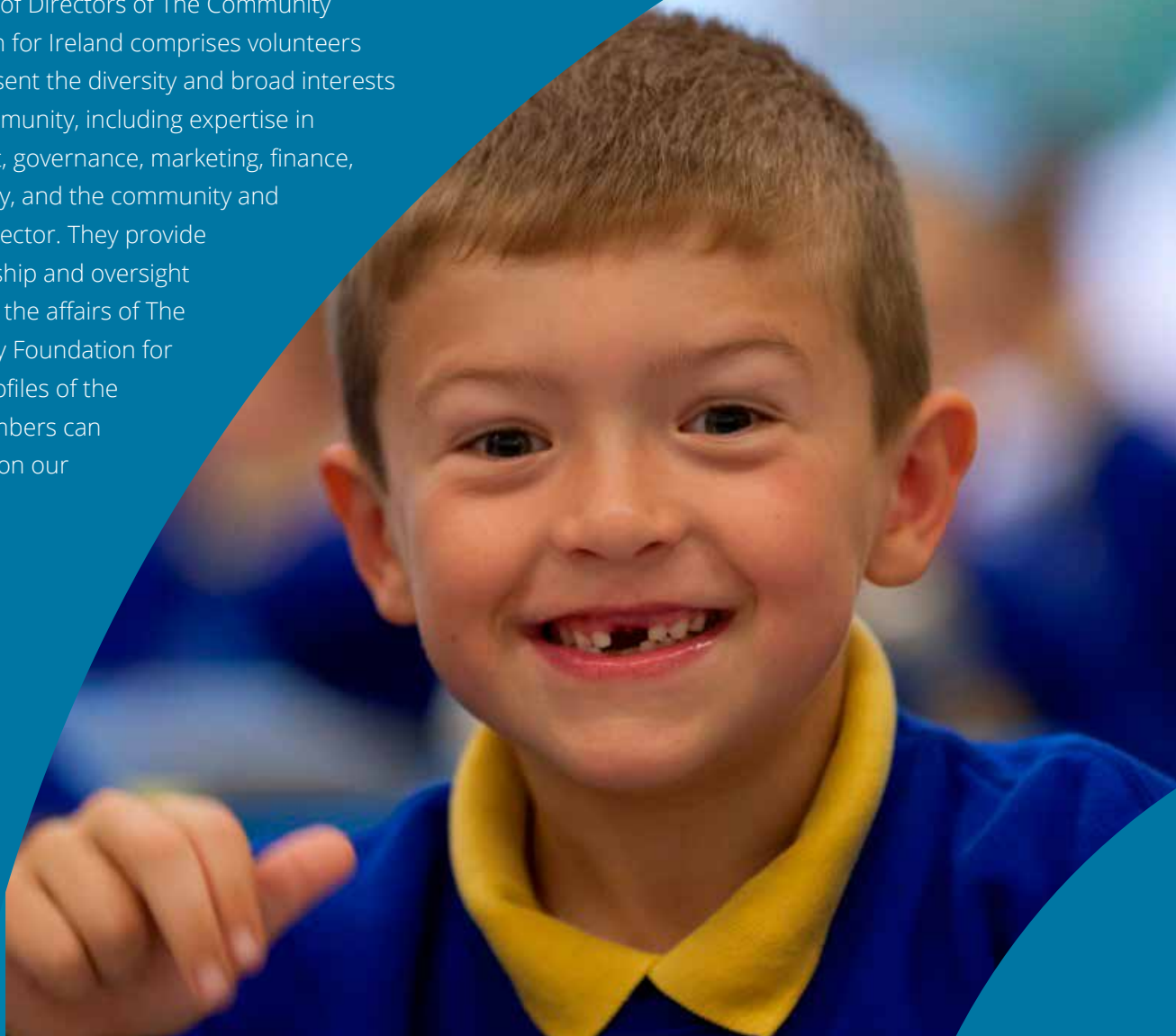

Report of the Board

The Board of The Community Foundation for Ireland presents its report and review of financial outcomes for the year ended 31st December 2018.

Objectives and activities

The Community Foundation for Ireland stands for a fair, caring and vibrant Ireland for now and the future, and empowers people who want to make a difference through a model of strategic giving which is effective and delivers. The Community Foundation for Ireland works towards being a centre of influence in our community and bring together the right people and resources to support strong and resilient communities.

The key focus of the three-year strategy (2018-20) is on Giving, Granting and Growing for Social Change. In 2018, The Community Foundation for Ireland focused its work around three strategic objectives:

- **Giving for Social Change**
- **Granting for Social Change**
- **Growing for Social Change**

At the heart of the strategy is a commitment to deliver meaningful impact and progressive social change. The following is a report of The Community Foundation for Ireland's work across the three areas in 2018.

Giving for social change

The Community Foundation for Ireland helps people and organisations to optimise their philanthropy by facilitating effective giving and by investing in people and solutions to benefit communities across Ireland and abroad. We use our knowledge to help donors translate their aspirations to 'give back' into impactful investments of their experience and resources. In 2018 we offered such support in a number of ways including:

- Working with donors in identifying clear pathways for donor education and engagement. In 2018, there were over 70 Donor Advised Funds and collaborative partnerships. We worked with individuals, families, corporates, and other trusts and foundations to support their charitable giving through the provision of specialist and bespoke services.

Ten new Donor Advised Funds were established in 2018.

- Providing a bespoke service to donors to support their giving. Our staff works closely with donors in administering their charitable donations as well as providing advice and support in relation to their grant making.
- Offering a suite of giving options, including once off donations, flow-through funds, term funds, endowed funds and legacy gifts. A particular focus of the 2018-2020 plan is to grow Donor Advised Funds and to position The Community Foundation for Ireland strongly for legacies.

- Launching The Community Foundation for Ireland's LGBT+ Fund at the GCN 30 year celebration event in June by the Minister for Children and Young People, Katherine Zappone, T.D.
- Facilitating and encouraging collaborative giving on the part of donors. During 2018, a number of donors added their support to The Community Foundation for Ireland grants, leveraging greater support for important causes and initiatives. For example, The Community Foundation for Ireland and a number of its donors are supporting SAFE Ireland and its ambitious programme of work to change culture and practice in respect of gender based violence in Ireland. A number of collaborative and strategic funding initiatives are also in place with other trusts. These include the Former Offenders Fund with The St. Stephen's Green Trust, as well as the Parenting Support Initiative in association with The Katharine Howard Foundation.
- Pressing the Government to have an enabling environment for philanthropy by incentivising major gifts and legacies.
- Providing opportunities for donor engagement and education. A number of events were hosted throughout the year. These included an annual donor evening which heard from Simon Anholt of Good Countries, Fr Peter McVerry and Liz Waters from An Cosán.
- Promoting greater philanthropy in Ireland through a number of initiatives and events including the 11th Philanthropist of the Year Awards. The winners were as follows:
 - Feargal Quinn as National Philanthropist of the Year for his long-standing and strategic support of charities both in Ireland and abroad including ISPCC, Family Support Network and Vita. Sadly Feargal Quinn passed away in April 2019.
 - Kerry Group as Corporate Philanthropist of the Year for its support and commitment to Concern, Special Olympics and many other charities.
 - Katharine Howard Foundation, which received the Brian Wilson Award for its significant and longstanding contribution to philanthropy in Ireland.
- Continuing to foster strategic partnerships with a number of other organisations, including Business in the Community Ireland, The Wheel, Philanthropy Ireland and My Legacy, as well as the UKCF (the network of Community Foundations in the UK) and the Community Foundations of Canada.

Granting for social change

We believe in an Ireland where everyone feels they belong, an Ireland where people are equal and communities thrive. In order to achieve this, we place grant making at the heart of our activities. By the end of 2018, The Community Foundation for Ireland's cumulative grant making exceeded €44 million. During 2018, 647 grants were made exceeding €7.4 million with the average grant size being €11,500. See all our grants on pages 31-57. The following are some of our grant making highlights:

- A number of strategic grants were awarded through our Donor Advised Funds that addressed important social issues in Ireland. Three such grants included funding the Future of Social Housing Report (UCD), a grant to the Children's Rights Alliance for the Child Refugee Development Project and another to Transparency Ireland for the production of the National Integrity Index.
- We continued to provide larger grants through our Impact Grants to support issues such as youth mental health, domestic violence, Travellers, older persons, former offenders, penal reform and refugees.
- The Community Foundation for Ireland also supports initiatives that build capacity within the community and voluntary sector. In 2018, we commissioned the report Remuneration Challenges and Successes in Post-Recession Times to assist organisations in the sector with the development of effective pay and pay-related policies and practices. In 2018, The Community Foundation for Ireland also supported small to medium non-profits in publishing their financial statements and annual reports. Publishing annual reports ensures a level of good practice, openness and accountability within the sector.
- The Community Foundation for Ireland managed and administered grant schemes on behalf of a number of trusts and foundations including The Tony Ryan Fund for Tipperary, Comic Relief, ShareGift and Early Childhood Ireland. We also ran an open grant round for the Lifes2Good Foundation which focused on providing grants for women's refuges in the West of Ireland.
- Each year The Community Foundation for Ireland reaches out to grant applicants for feedback in relation to our processes, service delivery and funding schemes. The assessment of The Community Foundation for Ireland from the grantees' perspective in 2018 was overwhelmingly positive with 74.8% describing our service as 'excellent' and 25.2% describing our service as 'good'. As recommended by the survey responses, we will continue to look at ways that we can support the sector in achieving the highest standards of governance and also provide support towards capacity building.
- We held three Learning Network Events throughout 2018 to bring together grantees. These events encourage collaboration, networking and provide a space to share learnings.

Granting for social change impacts

The Community Foundation for Ireland held a number of open grant rounds in 2018 to meet some of Ireland's most pressing social issues. Below are some of the impacts achieved:

Social Change Fund: €223,244

In 2018 funding was made available under three grant rounds from the Social Change Fund; Traveller Mental Health, Victims of Domestic Violence, and Refugees. With grants of up to €7,500 available, we awarded a total of €38,660 to six organisations under the Travellers stream, a total of €78,134 to 12 groups under the Victims of Domestic Violence stream and a total of €106,450 to 14 groups under the Refugees stream.

Projects under the Travellers stream addressed suicide prevention, in particular via the reduction of stigma around accessing mental health services. The Victims of Domestic Violence category

supported projects that offer a space and network for peer support and

recovery from mental health distress and trauma. The Refugees' category saw projects that support the recovery of people suffering from mental health distress and promote their integration into the local community, as well as projects that run targeted and culturally appropriate mental health promotion campaigns.

Older Persons' Fund: €174,865

In 2018, we had one open round of the Older Persons' Fund. We invited applications for grants of up to €7,500 under two categories - Advocacy and Active Citizenship. We awarded €49,890 with 9 successful grantees in the Advocacy Category and €49,975 with 10 successful grantees in the Active Citizenship category. In total for our open grant round we invested €99,865 in older persons' activities.

We also gave out one large strategic grant of €75,000 to Alone for research and service mapping to critically analyse service demand and service provision for older people.



AgeWell programme in Third Age

"We received funding from the Older Persons Fund for our weekly meetings where training takes place each week in relation to leadership, advocacy and active citizenship. After receiving AgeWell services, there were statistically significant improvements in client wellbeing, emotional and informational social support and self-rated health. Furthermore, one in five of clients reporting loneliness, no longer felt lonely and the proportion of clients at risk of poor wellbeing decreased by nearly 90%. These effects are far-reaching for clients and their families and by extension, the local primary care teams."





ReDiscovery Centre

“With generous funding from The Community Foundation for Ireland we were able to get people in the local area a lot more involved in biodiversity in a number of ways, such as the workshops with the local primary school and through our hands-on biodiversity events. Both allow so much engagement and learning which has a big impact in getting more people to care and show them what they can do at home.”



Women’s Fund: €45,000

In 2018, we decided to build on the growing wave of support for victims of sexual harassment. Through our Women’s Fund, we offered grants to organisations looking to make a real impact in that area. Through the Fund we made grants amounting to €45,000 to nine organisations, ranging from €3,000 to €10,000.

Environment and Nature Fund: €34,000

The first grant round from the Environment and Nature Fund was the Community Biodiversity Grant Round in 2018. We offered grants of up to €10,000 to organisations undertaking new work that aimed to protect, enhance, restore or create biodiverse habitats, or protect and provide shelter and/or food sources for native Irish species. We made grants amounting to €34,000 to six different community groups, with those grants ranging from €4,000 to €10,000. We plan on making the environment a key funding priority for The Community Foundation for Ireland over the next few years.

Funding for Annual Reports: €49,337

Upon feedback from our 2017 annual Grants Survey, The Community Foundation for Ireland saw a real need within the sector for capacity-building support that would enable smaller not-for-profit organisations to leverage and showcase the great work they do. With this in mind, we devised a grant round that would provide funding to small organisations to produce a robust, comprehensive and attractive annual report that demonstrated best practice in transparency and governance but that could also act as a tool to publicly highlight the work they do. In total we made 50 grants amounting to just under €50,000, with grants ranging from €285 to €1,000.

“This funding was so valuable to us as it allowed us to share our story with the community and also greatly contributed to further grant applications. Having a professional and informative Annual Report is key to securing grants and funding for our non-profit organisation.”



Granting for social change impacts (Continued)

Traveller Identity and Leadership: €109,000

Given the many barriers facing the Traveller community and our ongoing commitment to support issues affecting travellers, we ran two separate grant rounds for Traveller-led organisations in 2018. This was to support the development of Traveller leadership strategies. Of those who applied, three organisations were funded to a total value of €21,500, with the grants ranging from €5,500 to €10,000.

The second grant round invited innovative proposals that took a sensitive and creative approach to the Traveller identity crisis. Ten organisations were given grants amounting to €48,500 and those grants ranged from €3,600 to €6,000.

Further to these funding schemes, five impact grants were made to organisations aiming to improve the lives of Travellers by reducing racism, improving mental health outcomes and providing education and training for the Traveller community around voting and running for election. These grants amounted to €39,000 and ranged in size from €6,500 to €10,000.

Growing for social change

The final strand of our work is positioning The Community Foundation for Ireland as a catalyst for social change and also ensuring that there is an enabling environment for philanthropy in Ireland.

- A significant focus for The Community Foundation for Ireland over the next three years is to promote philanthropy in Ireland to those who have the means to give in a significant way. To promote philanthropy to policy makers and also the wider community, to highlight the potential for philanthropy and the impact it can have on our development as a nation.
- In order to showcase the services provided by The Community Foundation for Ireland, a new brochure was created in 2018. This brochure outlines the different mechanisms available to donors who want to engage in philanthropy, as well as a number of donor case studies.
- In late 2018 we launched a new report: Legacies for Good, Wealth Transfers and the Potential for Philanthropy in Ireland. The report analyses the current financial position of Irish households, examines how household wealth will be passed on to the next generation and highlights the resulting potential to grow philanthropy in Ireland. The Community Foundation for Ireland commissioned Jim O'Leary to produce this report to calculate the intergenerational transfer of wealth in Ireland and to highlight its potential impact on philanthropy in the future.
- A Corporate Philanthropy workshop was hosted in Xilinx in early 2018 and brought together a number of leaders including T.D Minister for Children and Young People, Katerine Zappone.
- Throughout 2018, The Community Foundation for Ireland produced a number of donor case studies under the Unsung Heroes Campaign. Six donor case studies and videos were released throughout the year to showcase the variety of donors who work with The Community Foundation for Ireland, what prompted them to engage in philanthropy, how their families are involved and the social issues that they have supported.
- We continued to work closely with professional advisers including solicitors, tax advisers, accountants and wealth managers, greatly assisted by The Community Foundation for Ireland Professional Advisers Group. The group met three times in 2018.
- As part of our commitment to encourage and grow legacy giving in Ireland we continued to participate in My Legacy Week in 2018. My Legacy is an umbrella group of 60 Irish charities. The group hopes to address the low level of will making in Ireland and to make legacy gifts the norm in Ireland, as a way of supporting charities into the future.

The other key focus in Growing for Social Change is to achieve operational excellence and to ensure that we have the capacity and resources to deliver the strategy. In 2018, main priorities were:

- To ensure a smooth transition to our new offices in Phibsborough (where we moved in December 2017) through completing requisite building works and to ensuring a good place to work for staff.
- To review our Governance and Compliance Framework. The review and any adjustments necessary were carried out. This is an ongoing key priority for the organisation and its board as trust is so important in the work we do.
- To establish best practice in GDPR and initiate actions to ensure continuous improvement. This was a real challenge in 2018 and took up a significant amount of management time. Any outstanding issues arising from the changes in 2018 are being addressed in 2019.
- IT Review. An examination of our long-term strategy for IT infrastructure was started in 2018 and will be complete in 2019, including a decision as to whether to go completely cloud based or not.
- Excellence through People certification. An assessment was carried out by the NSAI and the assessor was satisfied that the organisation merits continued Excellence through People certification.



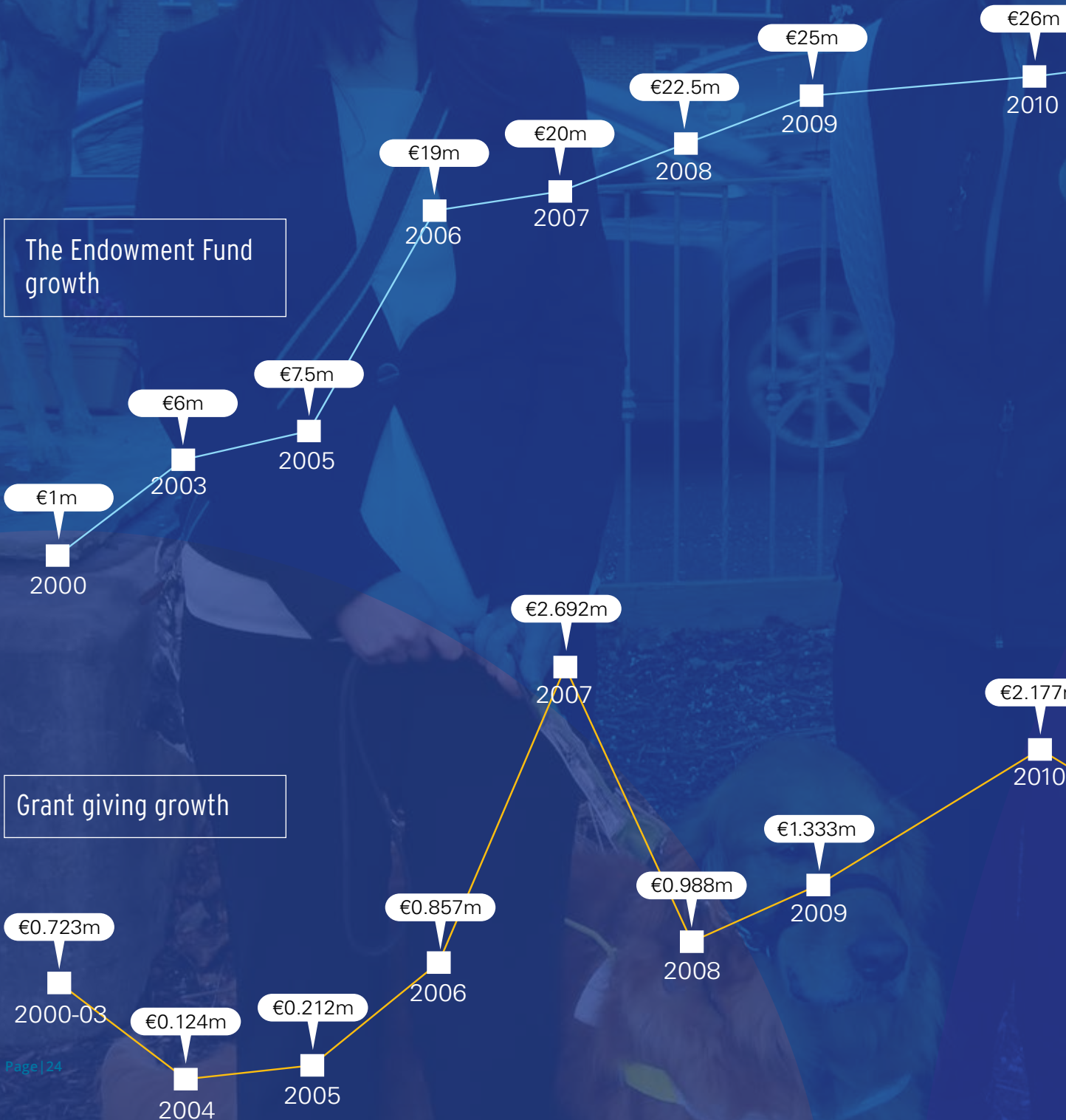
Unsung Hero Campaign, The Green Leaf Fund

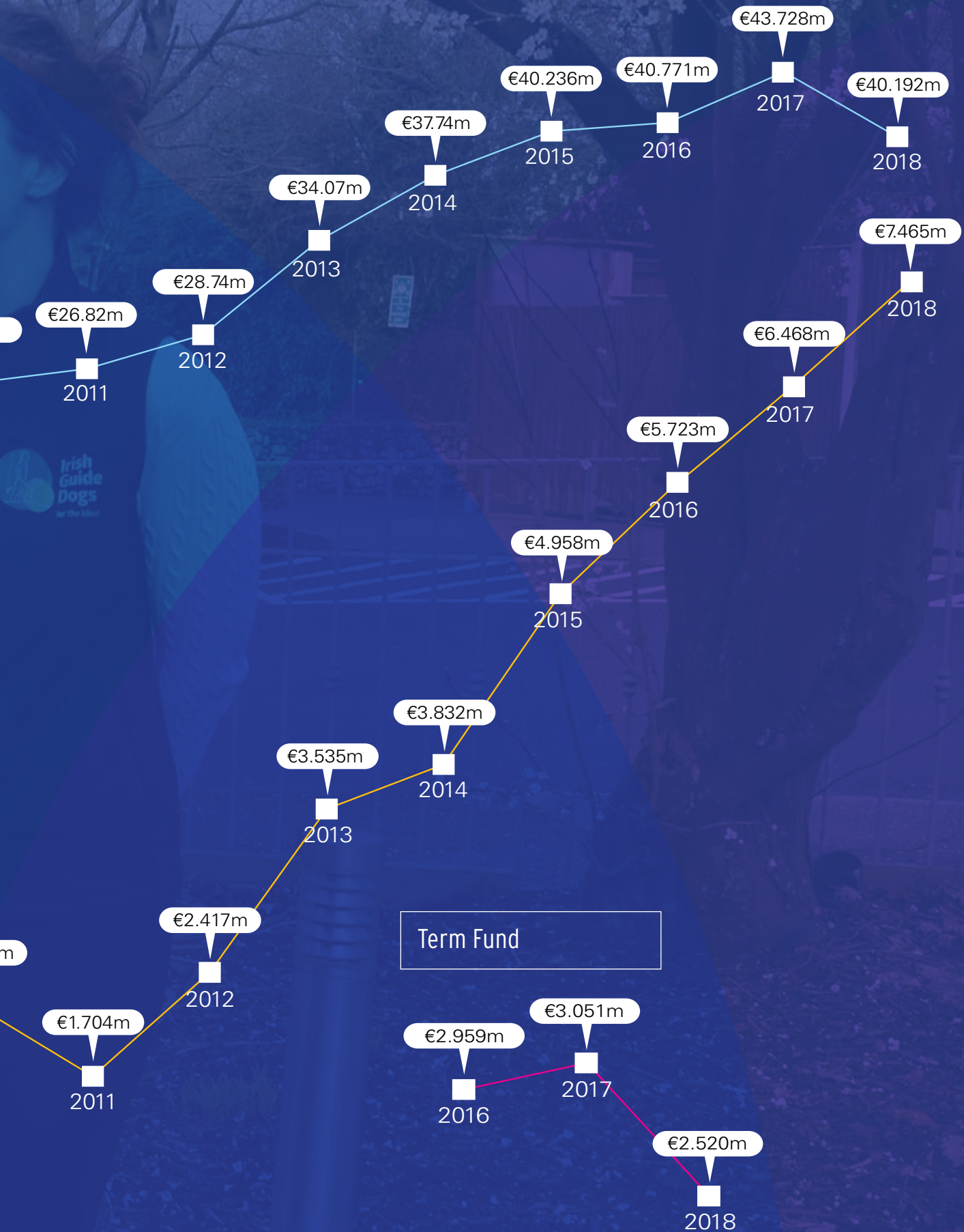
“The Green Leaf Fund was set up as a flow-through Donor Advised Fund in October 2015. On foot of a windfall gain from the sale of a company, the donor wanted to give back to their community in a low-key, private way. The Green Leaf Fund follows a welcome trend we have seen over the last number of years in The Community Foundation for Ireland of more female philanthropists setting up funds and leading the way in relation to strategic giving. To date, the Green Leaf Fund has given out €300,000 in grants to charitable organisations in Ireland. The fund has a particular focus on homelessness and the environment and has provided grants to fund innovative pilot programmes that allow non-profit organisations to develop creative solutions to systemic issues. Two such organisations the Green Leaf has supported are GIY and Food Cloud. These organisations are working toward creating more sustainable communities at both a local and national level.”



Review of financial outcomes

The graphic illustrates the growth in the size of The Community Foundation for Ireland's endowment fund in the past 18 years from less than €1m in 2000 to over €40m by the end of 2018. Collectively The Community Foundation for Ireland and its donors made grants in excess of €44.8million to communities and charitable causes in Ireland and overseas between 2000 and 2018. The term fund was set up in 2016 and the reducing balance reflects the spending down of the fund.





Investment powers and policy

The principal funding sources of The Community Foundation for Ireland continue to be private donations to Donor Advised Funds on the part of individuals, families, corporates and other charitable organisations. The grant making of The Community Foundation for Ireland in 2018 exceeded the grant making in 2017 and a significant outflow in funds resulted in net expenditure of (€4.113m) in 2018 (net income of €5.353m in 2017). In light of the ongoing requirements for grant making, The Community Foundation for Ireland drew on previously donated funds.

Endowment Fund

Since its inception, The Community Foundation for Ireland has operated a permanent, civic endowment fund with the aim of delivering a consistent and sustainable amount each year for grant making, in perpetuity. The Endowment Fund (the Fund) is a tax-exempt fund and is held in trust by the Board of Directors of The Community Foundation for Ireland. The operation of the Fund is governed by the company's constitution which also sets down the powers and responsibilities of the directors in relation to the fund.

The main purpose and priority of the fund is the delivery of a consistent and sustainable amount each year from the Fund's income and/or capital for grant making. The level of drawdown for grant making is set with the objective of protecting indefinitely the nominal value of the Fund's capital and providing a buffer against future inflation.

Specifically, other than in exceptional circumstances, an amount of 4% of the average end of year values for each of the previous 5 years is made available each year for grant making, regardless of the income or capital returns generated by the Fund in that year.

The Fund's current Investment Manager is Sarasin and Partners who were appointed to manage the Fund from 1st January 2015 (the transfer of the fund's assets to them took place on the 23rd April 2015).

The total value of the assets held by the Manager on behalf of the Endowed Fund at 31st December 2018 was €40,192,452. At 1st January 2018, the total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Fund was €43,728,503. During the year, the Investment Manager received €51,000, representing donations received from donors for investment in the Fund. The Fund also received investment income during the year (including tax reclaimed) of €903,585. A total amount of €1,619,932 was made available to The Community Foundation for Ireland to meet its grant making requirements and to cover some of its administrative costs. A further €196,293 was deducted to meet the Investment Manager's fees and other investment expenses. During the year, the fund depreciated by €2,674,411 and there was a fund closure of €23,234.

Term Fund

In 2016, The Community Foundation for Ireland established a second fund, a Term Fund, to receive donations from individuals, businesses and other foundations. As with the Endowment Fund, the fund is a tax-exempt fund which is held in trust and invested by the Board of Directors of The Community Foundation for Ireland. The operation of the fund is governed by the company's constitution which also sets down the powers and responsibilities of the directors in relation to the fund.

The Term Fund differs from the Endowment Fund in that the amount originally donated by each donor, and the investment return earned, will be spent over an agreed period of years by making available for grant making, on a regular basis, amounts pre-agreed with the donor. The Fund's initial investment Manager is Investec.

The total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Term Fund at 1 January 2018 was €3,051,396. The balance at 31 December 2018 was €2,520,081 net of amounts paid out for grant making (€378,450), administration fees (€28,486), capital depreciation (€109,013) and investment management fees (€15,366).

A Statement of both Funds' Investment Policy Objectives and Guidelines reflecting the policy, mandate and performance objectives of the manager is available on The Community Foundation for Ireland's website for inspection.

Financial risk management

Currency risk:

Much of the company's costs are denominated in euro and most income is received in euro with a small amount received in foreign currencies. Fluctuations in the value of the euro could have an adverse effect on the company's ability to deliver its planned programme of work. These currency risks are monitored on an ongoing basis.

Cash flow risk:

The company holds a number of bank accounts deposited in a number of different financial institutions ensuring the security of our funds and also endeavouring to maximise the return available. The company's activities expose it primarily to the financial risks of changes in interest rates. Interest bearing assets are held at fixed rates to ensure certainty of cash flows.

Credit risk:

The company's principal financial assets are bank balances and cash. The credit risk on cash at bank is limited because the counterparties are banks with high credit ratings assigned by international credit-rating agencies. The organisation has no significant concentration of credit risk, with exposure spread over a number of counterparties and customers.



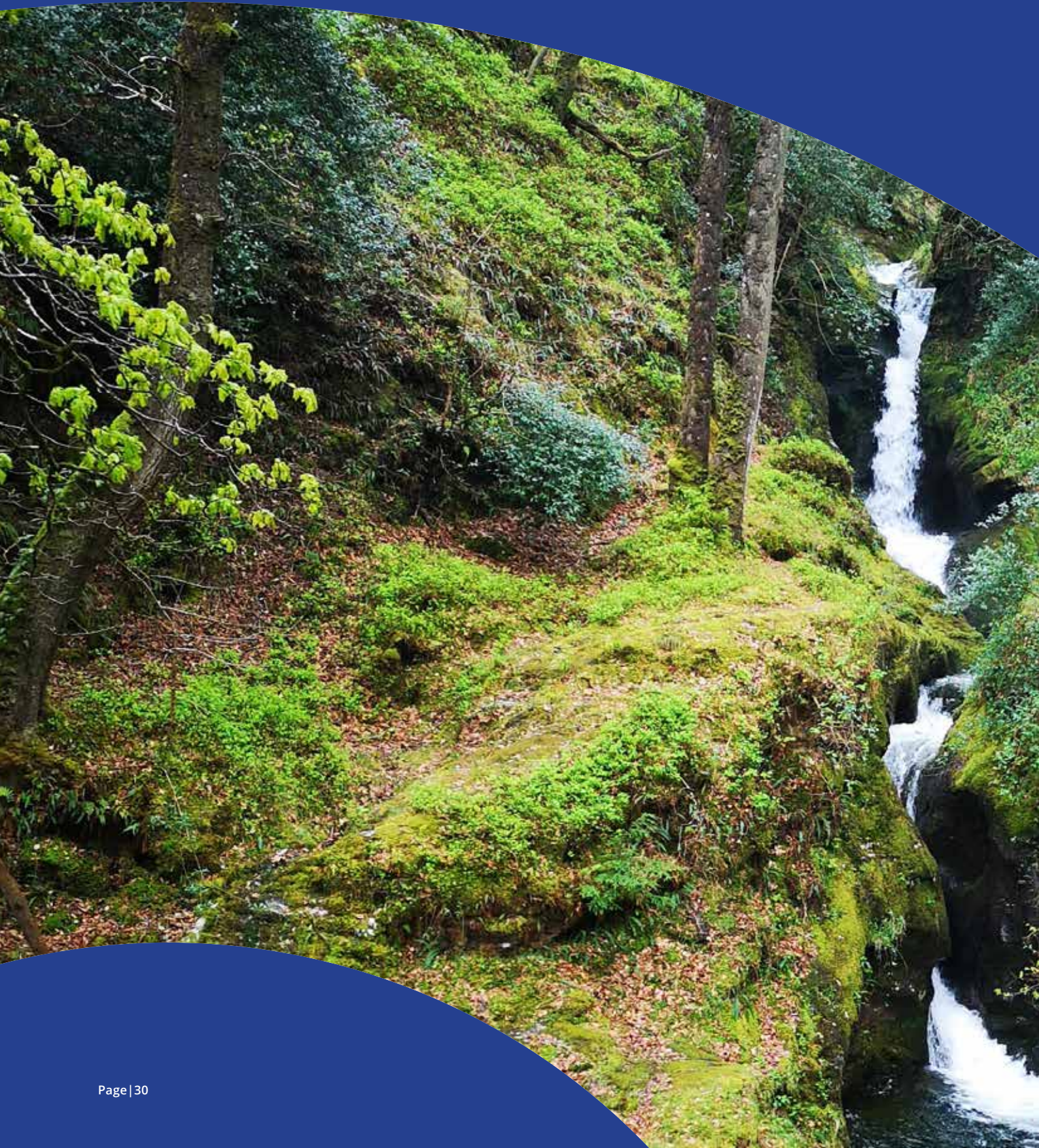
