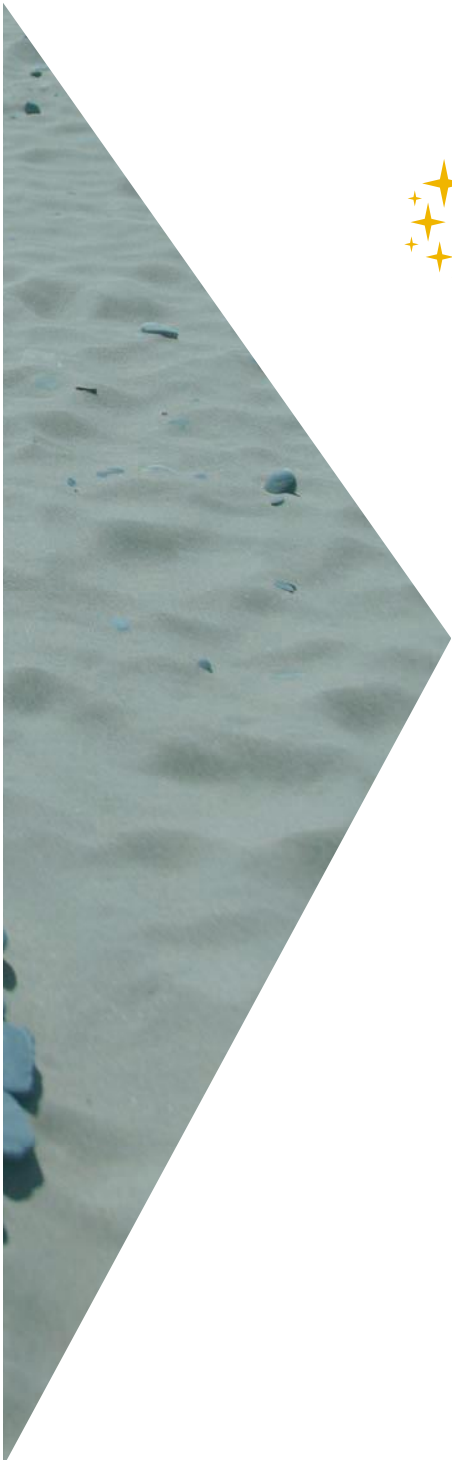

A message to our partners and friends

“Looking back, the decision to establish a community foundation in Ireland in 2000 showed considerable vision and foresight on the part of those who made it happen. Equally, it has been no mean achievement to start from nothing in 2000 and within 15 years to have an endowed fund of over €40m.”



In the fifteen years since it was established in 2000, The Community Foundation for Ireland (CFI) has been making a difference by making giving easy and investing in people and solutions to benefit communities throughout Ireland. Within CFI, we believe in the power of philanthropy to deliver just and progressive social change. We empower people and organisations who want to make a difference through a model of philanthropy which is based on trust, effectiveness and impact. This model has proven its effectiveness for over one hundred years since the first community foundation was established in 1914; there are now over 1800 globally.

This report gives us the opportunity to report to our stakeholders in relation to 2015, to reflect on the first fifteen years of The Community Foundation for Ireland, as well as considering the role CFI might play in the coming years.

There were welcome signs of economic recovery during 2015 which saw CFI's endowed funds exceed €40m for the first time, a record number of new donors and funds and grant making which approached €5m; the highest year to date.

One of the greatest achievements, and the bedrock of The Community Foundation for Ireland's success to date, has been the calibre of the management team in terms of running and growing the organisation effectively but also critically, in terms of the ethos of the organisation which is inclusive, open, transparent and progressive which has been carefully developed and promoted and is very distinctive from that in many other organisations.

We thank everyone who has supported The Community Foundation for Ireland since 2000 by believing and investing in our work. As with most aspects of life in a fast moving society, the nature and structure of philanthropy is constantly changing and evolving. The Community Foundation for Ireland needs to keep abreast of these changes and be flexible in adapting its service offerings to meet the ever changing needs of donors without compromising its fundamental principles and ethos. We believe that our experience over the past fifteen years provides us with a solid platform to strengthen our leadership role in supporting strong communities in Ireland and to deliver greater impact going forward.

15 years: a reflection - Tina Roche, Chief Executive

“The biggest impact CFI has made is to the thousands of community and voluntary groups across the nation who have applied for grants to do social good. They readily give their time and commitment to make positive changes in their neighbourhoods and build strong communities for us to live in and enjoy. While there have been over ten thousand grants over the fifteen years, a few stand out in my memory. One of our first ever grants in 2001, was to a LGBT group; this showed that we put our money where we said we would in terms of directly supporting equality. Another memorable grant was made to pay for a dishwasher in support of two elderly ladies’ monthly hosting of a ‘bachelor and bachelorette’ party in the parish hall! We have gathered donors together to help support Mental Health Reform and through this kept a vital advocacy group on the road. We supported the establishment of The Yellow Flag Programme which aims to teach our primary school children that being different is a good thing and to be admired and embraced as it is what makes us human.”

The Community Foundation for Ireland was set up in 2000 with the mission to be a driver of philanthropy in all its forms. The idea of setting up The Community Foundation for Ireland was raised in a report for Combat Poverty and was also helped by Ray Murphy who was then a senior executive with Tara Consulting (later The Atlantic Philanthropies) who facilitated early introductions to a group of CEOs of community foundations from Canada, North America and Europe. They very generously took me under their collective wing and showed me the way to establish a good solid foundation. They advised me to establish an independent endowed fund which would see us and our communities through the tough times and to keep our focus for grant making on social justice issues and to always remember that the donor is at the heart of the Foundation. From such small beginnings I could not have imagined that in 2015, our endowment would exceed €40 million and that our cumulative grant making would pass the €25m mark.

Throughout the last fifteen years, The Board of CFI has always been of immense character - open minded, transparent, focused on governance and growth with great Chairpersons at the helm. To say we owe the successive Chairpersons and Directors a debt of gratitude is an understatement. We have also managed to attract and retain excellent people in our organisation.

CFI has had the good fortune of meeting generous, strategic, engaged donors with both major and minor means. The one characteristic which joins them all is thoughtfulness. They think of others and they want to assist in building a robust dynamic society where all can live well, based on the principles of equality and fairness. They do what they can to achieve this vision and indeed increasingly want to do more. They also want to give more strategically so that they see lasting changes in their lifetimes. There are not enough people like them. Philanthropy in Ireland is still at the foothills though determined to climb to higher peaks.

From the Board to the communities we serve right across our small island, I have seen the generosity and passion of people. 1 Raising the level and effectiveness of philanthropy in Ireland

During 2015, The Community Foundation for Ireland played its part in promoting greater philanthropy in Ireland through a number of initiatives and events, which included:

- The 2015 Philanthropist of the Year Awards, which were held in January 2016. Carmel and Martin Naughton, Xilinx and Chuck Feeney and The Atlantic Philanthropies were given awards
- New research titled 'How Entrepreneurs View Philanthropy in Ireland', which CFI published in April 2015. This was generously supported by AIB Private Banking to address the paucity of research in relation to philanthropic donors in Ireland
- The launch of the second VitalSigns, which was first published in Canada almost a decade ago. The VitalSigns report is a scorecard on the vitality of the nation across key social areas
- Working closely with professional advisers including solicitors, tax advisers, accountants and wealth managers. They were greatly assisted by the CFI Professional Advisers Advisory Group
- Fostering strategic partnerships with a number of other organisations including Business in the Community Ireland, UKCF (the network of Community Foundations in the UK), The Community Foundation for Northern Ireland and Trans Giving Europe
- A special episode of Nationwide on RTE in December 2015, which profiled a number of grants awarded by The Community Foundation and its donors.

Making giving easy and transforming generosity into lasting change

The Community Foundation for Ireland helps people and organisations make a difference by making giving easy and by investing in people and solutions to benefit communities throughout Ireland. In 2015 we offered such support in a number of ways, including:

- Sharing our experience and knowledge of donor engagement. The Community Foundation for Ireland has more than 60 donor advised funds and collaborative partnerships. In line with its commitment to providing support and guidance to its donors, CFI hosted a number of briefing sessions for donors in areas which included mental health, the prevention of homelessness and the international refugee crisis
- Providing a bespoke service to donors to support their giving; 10 new donor advised funds were established in 2015
- Offering a suite of giving options ranging from once off donations and short term flow-through funds, through to longer term endowed funds. During 2015, CFI published a new legacy brochure that highlights the legacy opportunities that can be facilitated through The Community Foundation for Ireland
- Facilitating partnerships between donors and relevant organisations in the non-profit sector, as well as partnering with other trusts and foundations. These included the Katharine Howard Foundation, The Atlantic Philanthropies and two other trusts in the context of a new Infant Health and Wellbeing Fund; the St Stephen's Green Trust in relation to the Former Offenders Fund; and an anonymous trust in relation to our youth work stream.

Investing in people and solutions to build stronger communities

Grant making is at the heart of The Community Foundation for Ireland's activities. In 2015, grants exceeding €4.9m were made in support of community groups and charitable organisations, including:

- The Community Foundation for Ireland's flagship Caring Communities Grants programme, through which The Foundation targets its support in selected areas including respite for carers, youth unemployment, mental health, LGBT and migrant communities. Grants to support advocacy and civic engagement on the part of older people were also supported through the Older Persons' Fund (supported by The Atlantic Philanthropies). Underpinning these programmes is a strong commitment to shared learning about the impact of projects and outcomes
- The Community Foundation for Ireland's Impact Grant through which it addresses recurring issues or themes which may benefit from more strategic or longer term funding. In 2015, The Foundation awarded 25 Impact Grants approaching €500,000 to organisations including Children's Rights Alliance, Uplift, ENAR Ireland and Active Ageing Partnership. CFI also played a neutral convenor role in bringing together stakeholders around key social issues
- The Community Foundation for Ireland managed and administered grant schemes on behalf of a number of trusts and foundations including The Tony Ryan Fund for Tipperary, Dúnlaoi Teoranta, the Tomar Trust and a number of corporates in relation to community benefit schemes. The County Monaghan Fund continued its grant making in 2015 in support of a number of projects in the county
- Through the generosity of its donors, a wide range of individual grants were also made to non-profit organisations and projects throughout Ireland, as well as to overseas charities
- The Community Foundation for Ireland commissioned and published a survey of the Pay and Benefits of the sector in partnership with The Wheel, Dóchas and Fundraising Ireland.

“As we reflect on the first fifteen years of The Community Foundation for Ireland, it is interesting to consider the transformation that has been occurring in recent years with the donors we are working with. Increasingly, we are seeing our donors seek to effect societal change and move from reactive charitable giving to more meaningful engagement with issues and causes. Donors are seeking greater evidence of impact for their money and are much more willing to consider targeted interventions with measurable outcomes, and this means we do a lot of shepherding and relationship management before a grant is even made. 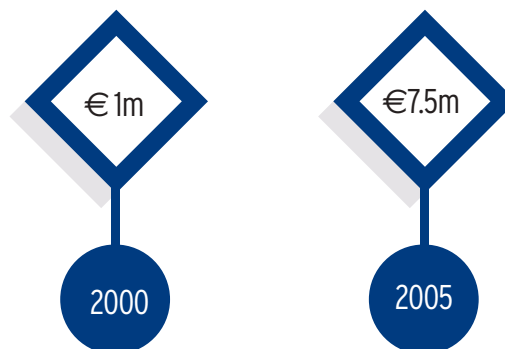
4 Learning from what we do and drawing on a century of experience of community foundations worldwide

- As part of an international network of over 1800 community foundations, The Community Foundation draws on a great diversity of experience in areas such as grant making, marketing and donor care. In 2015, CFI continued to manage a number of corporate funds through a partnership with the Silicon Valley Community Foundation. In addition, CFI staff had the opportunity to attend the UKCF Conference which was hosted by The Community Foundation for Northern Ireland in Belfast. Finally, CFI works closely with the Canadian Community Foundations in the context of VitalSigns
- Integrity is a core value of The Community Foundation for Ireland in terms of accountability, transparency and strong governance for those who entrust their funds to our stewardship. During 2015, CFI continued to strive to demonstrate value for money and best practice in all our areas of activity. CFI takes its stewardship role of donors and their funds very seriously and since its inception in 2000, CFI has adopted prudent investing and spending policies and also has a donor charter
- The Board of The Community Foundation is committed to attaining the highest standards of corporate governance. Accordingly, within CFI, transparency and accountability are constant priorities of the Board, its dedicated Finance, Audit, Investment and Governance Sub Committee and the staff of CFI
- Following an extensive review of its IT platforms, a new system 'D2' was successfully introduced in 2015 which is a bespoke version of the Digits system developed by UKCF and an upgrade of an earlier version of the system. Considerable planning, investment and training were made in designing and implementing the system which is critical in underpinning operational excellence, delivering efficient grant making and effective donor care.

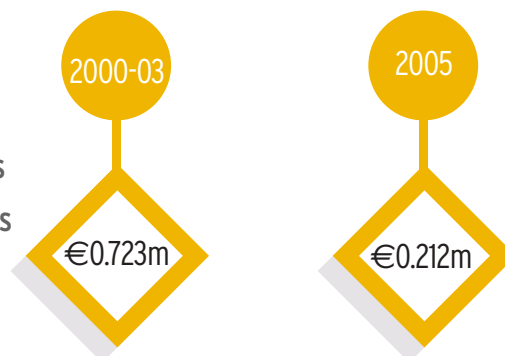

15 Years a reflection on grant making

Throughout the last fifteen years CFI and its donors have invested in people and solutions to benefit communities throughout Ireland. We have so many stories to tell from all our years of giving but here are just some highlights:



Supporting Social Justice

Since the beginning, a core tenet of CFI's work has been to seek social justice and equality for all with a particular focus on marginalised groups. One of our first grants, in 2001 was to support a LGBT project and we have been committed to supporting this community throughout our fifteen years, with a more recent focus on the Marriage Equality campaign.



Supporting Inclusiveness

Our donors know the importance of inclusiveness in Ireland, with many of them supporting the area of homelessness on both a large and small scale. Their support ranges from funding large capital projects through to smaller grants such as a donation of €5,000 to Merchants Quay Ireland for the purchase of a commercial cooker. As the homeless crisis in Ireland continues to worsen, CFI endeavours to work with our donors to make the most impactful grants for both preventative and front line service needs.

Supporting Communities

CFI is committed to support not only national but local organisations too. By funding local organisations such as Grow It Yourself (GIY), Community Growers and Men's Sheds, CFI supports them to harness the power of their communities.



Supporting Older People

Through the Older Persons' Fund (which was set up in 2014 with an initial investment of €3 million in collaboration with The Atlantic Philanthropies), older people have been given a medium to have their voices heard and listened to on a national platform. Craol (the network and support group for Irish Community Radio), one of the Older Persons' Fund's main grantees, has worked with almost 150 older people through community radio initiatives to date and will continue this work in 2016. These initiatives have trained older people to become presenters and advocates for their communities.



Supporting Women

The Women's Fund for Ireland was established in 2010 as a long-term philanthropic fund, connecting women who care with causes that matter. The Women's Fund fuels change in our communities by supporting the most innovative and positive solutions to the issues facing women and girls today. The fund began with small grants aimed at reducing and preventing domestic violence and supporting leadership at a community level. Drawing on learning from these grants and consultation within the sector, CFI decided to invest in a multi-annual programme of strategic initiatives. These initiatives, that are being led by Safe Ireland and a number of CFI donors, have also pledged their support for such interventions, including the Man Up Campaign, trauma research, researching the economic cost of domestic violence and establishing a legal advocacy unit.

Supporting Youth

Arising from the publication of a special edition Youth VitalSigns report in 2014, CFI has set up a Youth Fund to help and support young people, specifically in the area of employment. To date €100,000 has been given out in grants through the Youth Participation Panel (YPP) that was established as a youth grant making panel to provide funding recommendations to CFI. Grants have included support for soft-skills and youth leadership initiatives with regional organisations from the four provinces, as well as a grant of €80,000 to SpunOut for the establishment of an online youth employment hub, set to launch in 2016.





Fund Management 2015

The Endowment Fund (the Fund) is a tax-exempt fund and is held in trust by the Board of Directors of The Community Foundation for Ireland (CFI). The operation of the Fund is governed by CFI's Memo and Articles of Association which also sets down the powers and responsibilities of the Directors in relation to the Fund. Careful financial management has been a hallmark of The Community Foundation since its inception. The total value of the assets held by the Manager on behalf of the Fund at 31st December 2015 was €40,346,918.

At 1st January 2015, the total value of the assets held by the Investment Manager on behalf of the Fund was €37,738,897. During the year, a further €2,248,543 was received, representing donations received from donors for investment in the Fund. The Fund also received investment income during the year (including tax reclaimed) of €979,388. A total amount of €1,067,213 was made available to CFI to meet its grant making requirements and to cover its administrative costs. A further €183,041 was deducted to meet the Investment Manager's fees and other investment expenses. During the year, the fund achieved a total capital appreciation of €630,344.

Revised Investment and Distribution Policy and Review of Investment Management

Up to the end of 2014, the Fund's strategy had been implemented by using the income generated by the Fund's investments to meet CFI's administration fees and the investment management costs with the balance being available for grant making.

Following a review by the Finance, Audit, Investment and Governance (FAIG) Committee, the Board of CFI decided that, with effect from 1st January 2015 (and subject to the agreement of donors (since received)), the Fund would adopt a 'total return' approach to investment, i.e. no distinction would be drawn between income and capital returns. The main purpose and priority of the Fund would, however, be the delivery of a consistent and sustainable amount each year from the Fund's income and/or capital for grant making. At the same time, the level of drawdown for grant making would be set with the objective of protecting indefinitely the nominal value of the Fund's capital and providing a buffer against future inflation. A revised Statement of the Fund's Investment Policy Objectives and Guidelines has been implemented with effect from 1st January 2015 and is available on the CFI website for inspection (www.communityfoundation.ie).
